- (0.6 miles) 11<sup>th</sup> Street to 22<sup>nd</sup> Street
- (0.7 miles) 22<sup>nd</sup> Street to 34<sup>th</sup> Street
- (1.0 miles) 34<sup>th</sup> Street to Fidalgo Bay Resort
- (1.0 miles) Fidalgo Bay Resort to March Point Rd.
